I. <u>Organization/Agency Background</u>: State your mission, vision, purpose, and provide a brief history. What are your core programs and activities? How many people do you serve? How many paid staff, full time and part-time? How many volunteers?

All Faiths Food Bank was formed in 1989 by a group of faith-based organizations that were providing food their respective pantries. It is the only Food Bank serving Sarasota and DeSoto County. In 2016, the Board of Directors adopted a new mission: Together with our partners, we provide healthy solutions to end hunger in our community. The new mission reflects the long-term commitment to increasing the amount of fresh produce and nutritious food provided by the Food Bank to those in need. It also represents an acknowledgement that hunger is a health issue.

With the support of our Partner Agencies in Sarasota and DeSoto County, All Faiths Food Bank provided over 8.8 million pounds of food last year to more than 64,000 people.

There are currently 37 full-time staff members, 2 part-time staff members and over 2,600 volunteers that are a part of All Faiths Food Bank.

Our programs fall into 2 main categories: Food Distribution and Health and Nutrition Education. Food Distribution

We distribute food in two ways: 1) Agency Partners and Programs that provide food directly to clients or use the food to prepare meals; and 2) All Faiths' own service programs which also provide food directly to those in need. All Faiths' direct service programs include Mobile Pantries, Backpacks, School-Based Pantries, and Sprout Mobile Farm Market.

Health and Nutrition Education

We provide programs for low-income children and families to help give children a healthier start in life. Cooking Matters is a 6-week nutrition and cooking education program that helps families with limited resources learn to make healthy meals at home.

II. <u>Project Information</u>: Describe your food distribution program. All Faiths Food Bank serves more than 63,000 neighbors in need through its member network. Sarasota County has 383,000 residents; DeSoto County is a rural county with nearly 37,000 residents and is considered a Rural Medically Underserved Area. In 2016, All Faiths Food Bank served 67% females and 33% males, of which 56% identified as White, 20% Black and 35% Hispanic. All Faiths Food Bank provides nutritious foods to families through Partner Agency Food Pantries and meals, mobile food distributions, Sprout Mobile Farm Market and School Pantries. Age breakdown of those served include 20-29 (10.3%), 30-39 (17.3%), 40-49 (17.4%), 50-59 (18.9%), 60-69 (15.6%).

The Mobile Pantry program is one of our most effective and efficient programs, mobile pantries visit a site once a month. In 2016, a total of 679,242 pounds of produce were delivered to individuals through the Mobile Pantry program.

Sprout Mobile Farm Market trucks bring, bi-monthly, an array of fresh, seasonal fruits and vegetables to residents in Sarasota and DeSoto Counties. In 2016, 667,000 pounds of produce were given out at 295 Sprout Routes stops.

All Faiths provides food and produce to 16 School and Family Pantries and has 57 Partner Agencies who distribute food, including produce to community members in need.

We use food bank inventory software, Primarius, to monitor the receipt and distribution of food. Primarius identifies by type, location, donation source, amount, frequency and time. Monthly reports are reviewed. All Faiths' Client Information Management System (CIMS) collects data on demographics and utilization/frequency of services.

This grant will support the fresh produce program, allowing All Faiths Food Bank to reach an estimated 30,000 individuals. More important, it will help make sure that families, no matter what their income or where they live, have the nutritious food they need to live healthy lives.

9. Describe the project's key outcomes and results based on the goals and objectives.

The overall impact of the BackPack Program was to provide nutritious food for children to take home on Fridays so they have enough to eat over the weekend, ultimately aiming to reduce food insecurity among these low-income children. One hundred percent (100%) of the food has to be purchased to assure the quality, consistency and appropriateness for children. The funds from this grant were specifically used to purchase fruit cups to add to the BackPacks. During this grant period:

- 63,680 BackPacks (12/1/2016 5/31/2017)
- o 3,238 children (estimated unduplicated)
- o 39 schools
- 10. Please describe any challenges/obstacles the organization encountered (if any) in attaining stated goals & objectives.
 - 1. Currently there are 21,000 children receiving free and reduced lunch in Sarasota County, we are only reaching 15% (3,238) of those children with our BackPack Program.
 - 2. The cost of the backpack is higher because we do not have a large enough facility to buy in economies of scale, AFFB is currently in a facility expansion phase, upon completion there will be more warehouse space for storage.
 - 3. We base the progress of the BackPack Program on the number of children on the free and reduced lunch program. What we do not have is data on many children that are not school age yet are struggling with hunger.

- 11. How did the organization overcome and/or address the challenges and obstacles?
 - We continue to work with the schools to ensure that students and parents are aware of the BackPack program. As the Food Bank does not have direct contact with the students, it is crucial to have a champion at the school to promote the program and help identify students. All Faith's will be testing new marketing methods in the 2017-18 school year to raise awareness of the program.
 - AFFB is currently under a facility expansion, once the warehouse expansion is completed, there will be more space to store materials for the BackPack. All Faiths continues to apply for funding and seek individual donors to support the BackPack program.
 - 3. To help fill a void of BackPacks not accounting for non-school age children in the household, All Faiths Food Bank is currently implementing a total of 13 School Pantries. School Pantries allow for families to visit a Pantry at their school and bring home food for the whole family. In addition, during the summer months, BackPacks are available at partner sites for children of all ages regardless of being in school.
- 12. Describe any unintended positive outcomes as a result of the efforts supported by this grant.

During the 2016-2017 academic year, All Faiths worked closely to gather input from children on the content on the BackPacks. It was evident that certain items in the BackPacks were not being consumed by children due to lack of interest or the steps involved to prepare the meals. A new menu was developed to address these limitations. The menu was created by our staff dietitian and then approved by the University of Florida Family and Consumer Sciences, and adheres to USDA Guidelines.

13. Briefly describe the impact this grant has had on the organization and community served.

According to Sarasota School District, more than 21,000 children – over half of the children enrolled in the schools - face food insecurity and need the free and reduced lunch program. For many of these children, this is the only meal they will receive that day. If we factored in the 'invisible children' - their younger siblings - the number of hungry kids is closer to 40,000.

All Faiths Food Bank BackPack Program provides food to children who are living in households that are food insecure. The criteria set-forth in regard to age include school-aged children between 5-18 years. The overall outcome of the program will be the reduction of food insecurity among children in the participating schools.

All Faiths is the only Food Bank in Sarasota and DeSoto Counties and no other organizations provide backpacks with the same consistency, magnitude and scope. Our backpacks provide meals and snacks for one child for two days, and different items are rotated on monthly basis. The menu was created by our staff dietitian and then approved by the University of Florida Family and Consumer Sciences, and adheres to USDA Guidelines.

During the 2016-2017 school year, 39 schools and an average of 3,200 students participated weekly. The total number of backpacks distributed during the school year was 97,554.

All Faiths Food Bank BackPack Program can help address the need with the children identified by the school guidance counselors as being at greatest risk – about 3,200 total. Backpacks go home with children every Friday during the school year and contain enough easy to prepare, kid-friendly food for 5 meals and snacks. Additional backpacks are provided over holidays and long weekends.

The grant funds were used to purchase 485 cases of peach fruit cups to include in the bags of food provided to children through our BackPack Program. This translates into 23,820 fruit cups that were provided to school age children facing food insecurity. The corresponding receipts will be sent to the email address listed above.

15. Please relate a success story.

Students have reported sharing their BackPack food with their siblings, they are excited about the contents in the BackPacks and enjoy sunflower seeds, fruit cups and cereal bars.

From a parent:

"I have two that bring home snacks and they are so excited to have those snacks. It's food I don't have to tell them to save for a specific meal. They know they can eat it whenever they want throughout the weekend and it makes them happy to share!"



"My grandmom always asks me on Friday did you bring your backpack today?"


"It helps my family because it makes them happy and we have more food."
