XXV. <u>Organization/Agency Background</u>: State your mission, vision, purpose, and provide a brief history. What are your core programs and activities? How many people do you serve? How many paid staff, full time and part-time? How many volunteers?

Golden Harvest Food Bank is a volunteer-driven, non-profit organization that provides quality food and other grocery products to those in need. We do this with local community support through direct service programs, partner agencies, and community education about hunger.

Golden Harvest Food Bank serves the hungry in a30-county service area in eastern Georgia and western South Carolina. The Food Bank was founded in Augusta, Georgia, in 1982, and now operates from three distribution centers -- Augusta, GA and Aiken and Anderson, SC. Golden Harvest is a locally-supported 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides grocery products to the hungry through a network of more than 300 direct service programs and food pantries. Golden Harvest distributed more than 17.4 million pounds of grocery products to those in need in fiscal year 2017, and since its founding has distributed more than 279 million pounds of food. In 2016, we served 979,321 duplicated individuals, 128,890 of which were seniors and 166,294 of which were children.

Our core activities are the acquisition, inspection, storage, and distribution of food to the hungry through partner agencies and direct service programs. Golden Harvest operates three food grade warehouses with the hard work of 46 paid staff, 1 part time staff, and more than 2,000 registered volunteers.

II. <u>Project Information</u>: Describe your food distribution program. Explain the community need including demographics, geographic characteristics of the area or community to be served, community conditions and income level. What are the specific activities of the food program? How do you identify/qualify those in need? How often is the food distribution offered? How many people will be served by the food distribution program (children, youth, adults, seniors)? Please explain how you keep track of number of people served.

Golden Harvest Food Bank requests funding to purchase food that will be given out to hungry families through our Emergency Meals Program. Golden Harvest feeds hungry families and individuals through a network of more than 300 food pantries and direct service programs located throughout 30 counties of eastern Georgia and western South Carolina. Golden Harvest works with these agencies to acquire, store, and distribute high quality food and other grocery product to hungry families and children. The size of the collaborative effort reflects the tremendous need for food assistance in the community.

According to the USDA, these 30 counties are home to more than 213,000 individuals, or 16.5% of the population, who struggle with food insecurity. More than 1 in 4 children (23.4%) – an estimated 69,000 individuals – struggle to get enough food to eat. Golden Harvest will use the funds to purchase food that will be given to the hungry through our network of agency partners. Agency partners include food pantries, soup kitchens, homeless shelters, senior centers, schools, domestic violence shelters, and other community hunger relief organizations. Food distribution schedules vary by agency, with some providing daily meals and others doing so on a weekly or monthly schedule. Clients are qualified through the use of self-declarations forms that are regulated by the USDA. Each agency reports monthly on the number of families served, the number of individuals within those families, and the total amount of food provided.

With bulk purchases, the \$10,000 will provide nearly 15,000 lbs. of desirable, healthy, shelf stable food. Upon receiving the items, they will be entered into our inventory system and made available to our partners, who will add them to their orders and distribute them to the hungry.

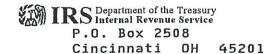
