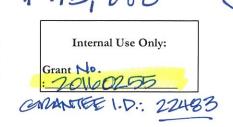

I. Organization Background; Target Populations

Planned Parenthood Keystone (PPKey) is the result of a July 2013 merger bringing together Planned Parenthood of Central Pennsylvania with Planned Parenthood of Northeast Mid-Penn & Bucks County. Many of the regions served by PPKey were once independent affiliates, some of which have been providing essential health care services to Pennsylvania residents since the 1920s. The mission of Planned Parenthood Keystone is to provide and promote access to the essential health care services and comprehensive education people need to live healthier lives and to build strong communities.

Specifically, Planned Parenthood offers: <u>Health Care Services</u>- PPKey serves nearly 40,000 patients annually with essential health care services at 15 medical centers. All patients are served regardless of their ability to pay. Many are uninsured or underinsured and for that reason their annual visit to PPKey may be the only health care they receive the entire year. <u>Education-PPKey provides comprehensive</u>, medically accurate and age-appropriate sexuality and reproductive health education to over 10,000 young people annually. PPKey delivers preventative education within its medical centers and through partnerships with schools, colleges, treatment facilities, community and faith based organizations throughout the service area. <u>Advocacy-PPKey supports</u> an individual's right to make informed decisions regarding their health while advocating public policies which guarantee these rights and ensure access to such services.

PPKey's leadership, dedicated staff, and supporters have grown the organization into a strong and vibrant provider of essential health care services. Recent accomplishments include: Full implementation and meaningful use of Electronic Health Records (EHR)- ensuring vulnerable populations are cared for with the highest levels of confidentiality, efficiency and transparency available in the field of health care; Online Appointment Scheduling (OAS)- allowing a patient to schedule same day or next day appointments through the convenience of PPKey's website; and The Patient Portal- making EHR accessible and understandable to patients and medical staff.

PPKey serves 37 counties throughout the state of Pennsylvania, which is home to 43% of Pennsylvania residents. The vast geographic nature of the affiliate embodies varying types of settings; including urban, rural, and suburban. The affiliate serves women, men, and young people of all backgrounds, although the majority of patients fall below the federal poverty level.

II. Project Information

According to research carried out by Advocates for Youth, a global nonprofit organization focusing on adolescent sexual and reproductive health; homophobia, transphobia, and heterosexism in our communities "all contribute negatively to LGBTQ youth's mental, spiritual, emotional, and physical well-being", as evidenced by high rates of attempted and completed suicide, violence victimization, substance abuse, teenage pregnancy, truancy, school dropout, family problems, homelessness and HIV/Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) associated risky behaviors. Middle school and high school can be an especially difficult time for LGBTQ students. Lamdada Legal Defense Fund, reports that: 84.6% of LGBTQA students have been

verbally harassed; 40.1% have been physically harassed; and 55% have experienced electronic harassment, dubbed "cyberbullying."²

LGBTQ youth are at risk from preventative health conditions brought about by unprotected sex, suicide ideation and drug use. Poor familial relations has been cited as a major reason for these negative health trends. Unsupported LGBTQ youth are: 8 times more likely to report having attempted suicide; nearly 6 times as likely to report high levels of depression; more than 3 times as likely to use illegal drugs; and 3 times as likely to be at high risk for HIV and sexually transmitted diseases.

Each year, PPKey serves over 10,000 unique individuals through its education services, and over 300 are youth participants in one of the following programs, which are at the crux of the LGBTQA+ Youth Project: The Spectrum (Berks County) The Curve (York County), and The Rainbow Room (Bucks County). The LGBTA+ Youth Project is supported by two community health educators, the Education & Training Manager, and overseen by the Senior Director of Education & Training.

PPKey's LGBTQA+ Youth Project is a small but vital project within the organization's Education Department. The LGBTQA+ Youth Project provides a safe, supportive, and empowering environment for LGBTQA+ youth who are at risk for harassment, bullying, and discrimination in their social environments, schools and home life. Through opportunities to socialize, volunteer and lead, the program equips young people with the skills they need to develop a vital support network. In doing so, young people experience greater cohesion and support from families and friends. Through ongoing sexuality education youth are empowered with the information they need to make healthy choices regarding serious health behaviors. Youth are also informed on where to access essential health care including STD testing and treatment, birth control, emergency contraception, Pap Tests and cancer screening services. Through collaboration the program builds understanding and cohesion within the community. In doing so, youth experience greater inclusion in accessing institutions such as schools, colleges and work places. The objectives of the LGBTQA+ Youth Project are:

<u>Objective I</u>: To significantly impact the lives of LGBTQA+ youth by inspiring positive shifts in personal self image, relationships and support networks.

Activities: Hold one Youth Development Summit that will bring at least 80 The Rainbow Room, Spectrum, and The Curve participants together to provide an opportunity for youth to plan and implement an event as a team.

Objective II: To increase knowledge of gender and sexual identity and sexual health.

Activities: Provide 275 hours of programming to LGBTQA+ youth focused on inclusive sexuality education, life skills, advocacy, and recreation through weekly sessions of *The Rainbow Room*, *The Spectrum*, and *The Curve*.

<u>Objective III</u>: Educate youth serving professionals on LGBTQA+ youth to ensure cultural competence, health education and support for these youth.

Activities: Conduct 12 professional development trainings focused on supporting LGBTQA+ youth to organizations who serve youth.

The timeline for the LGBTQA+ Youth Project is as follows:

<u>Summer 2016</u>: work plan for the project is created; FY17 programming begins at all three sites; professional training outreach plan is created; planning for Youth Development Summit begins; 1st quarter evaluations administered to participants; and outreach for professional trainings is completed.

Fall 2016: Site and speakers determined for Youth Development Summit; 2nd quarter evaluations administered to participants; and, by the end of December, 6 of our professional trainings will have been delivered.

<u>Winter 2017</u>: Outreach for the Youth Development Summit begins; 3rd quarter evaluations administered to participants; and all logistics (transportation, food, and agenda) for Youth Development Summit are completed.

<u>Spring 2017</u>: Youth Development Summit is conducted; 4th quarter evaluations administered to participants; year-end summary report is created; and, by the end of June, 12 total professional trainings will have been delivered.

This program is open to 14 to 21 year olds and serves young people who identity as LGBTQA+. Over the past few years, estimates of the number of people in the United States who identify as LGBTQA+ vary from 3.4% (Gallup/Williams Institute) to 10% (Kinsey Institute). While the estimates vary, it is generally agreed that LGBTQ people are found in all walks of life, among all racial/ethnic groups, and at all socioeconomic levels. Individuals can become aware of same-sex attraction and gender dysphoria very early in life. However, since many youth begin to date and have relationships with one another in middle and high school, many LGBTQA+ youth begin to self-identify during this time.

Over the last two fiscal years, PPKey has witnessed a 50% growth in its *LGBTQA+ Youth* Project, and PPKey expects to reach an even greater number of participants in FY17 and beyond. The target for the program period (FY17) is to reach over 325 participants each year, and to retain a high number of visits recorded for each participant.

Statewide there are very few providers of services to the LGBTQA+ community. However, PPKey works to educate, inform and include local community organizations and schools to increase understanding, and improve accessibility to mainstream services. The Bradbury-Sullivan LGBT Community Center (formerly Pennsylvania Diversity Network) highlights just several other "LGBTQ friendly" organizations within our region; including, Central Bucks School District Gay Straight Alliance and Bucks County Council on Alcoholism & Drug Dependence, Inc. Juvenile Alcohol & Other Drug Awareness Program. PPKey's is unique in its specific focus and thorough understanding of the needs of the LGBTQA+ community and how to support LGBTQ participants. However, what makes PPKey especially unique and impactful is the two pronged approach to health care; delivering vital health and sexuality education in conjunction with accessible, affordable health care.

In addition to volunteers recruited by PPKey's Director of Marketing and Volunteers, former participants (who have aged out of the program) often become volunteers to help implement the program and lead weekly discussions

Managed by PPKey's Education Department, the anticipated outcomes of this project reflect the empowering impact of an education program tailored specifically to the needs of this marginalized group:

- Participants will agree that they feel comfortable with themselves, good about themselves, and safe at these programs;
- Participants will agree that they have strong support network of peers in the group;
- Participants will correctly identify three services that Planned Parenthood provides;
- Participants will correctly identify three ways to improve or protect their sexual health; and
- Participants can identify three ways to prevent STIs and HIV.

In order to ensure that these outcomes are met, the *LGBTQA+ Youth Project* is subjected to ongoing quarterly evaluation by the Education Department. Participants complete a quarterly survey that measures the outcomes identified above. Education staff utilize this information to help improve programming and best meet the needs of the youth we serve.

Funding from the S.L. Gimbel Foundation Fund would go towards a combination of salaries and programmatic expenses to implement The Rainbow Room, The Spectrum and The Curve, as well as to offer the first ever LGBTQA+ Youth Summit.

III. Project Future

PPKey continues to engage in community fundraising efforts to financially support the educational components of its services, including the *LGBTQA+ Youth Project*. In addition to community fundraising efforts that engage individual donors and foundations, PPKey hosts the event *Sing Out Loud and Proud* and *April Follies* to specifically benefit the *LGBTQA+ Youth Project*.

IV. Governance, Executive Leadership and Key Personnel/Staff Qualifications PPKey's Board of Directors offer their time voluntarily. All Board Members participate in quarterly board meetings with the Interim CEO and other executive staff members. Each board member serves on a committee, setting strategy for key areas of the organization such as Development, Finance and Governance. Board Members develop important relationships within their local communities by attending PPKey partnership councils and events.

PPKey's Interim CEO reports to the Board of Directors and manages the Office of the President; overseeing Technology, HR and Security, External Affairs, Finance and Medical Services. Each department is overseen by a member of the Executive Team. The Chief Advancement Officer oversees External Affairs, which Education & Trainings is under. Education & Training is lead by professionals in the field of sexuality education. Education staff have published articles on LGBTQA+ Youth, participated in the planning committees and provided presentations at a number of important conferences including the PA Association of Drug Court Professionals, National Sex Ed Conference and PA Adolescent Sexual Health Conference.

1. Personnel

Rainbow Room, Spectrum and The Curve Coordinators

Coordinate all weekly LGBTQA+ Youth Program activities including scheduling, facilitating programming, managing volunteers, and collecting and entering all required data. Coordinators will also help to deliver professional trainings on LGBTQA+ youth in the counties they serve. Rainbow Room Coordinator \$14 hour 6.5 hours per week x 52 weeks = \$4,732.00 Spectrum Coordinator \$19.50 hour x 6.5 hours per week x 52 weeks = \$6,591.00 The Curve Coordinator \$16.77 hour x 6.5 hours per week x 52 weeks = \$5,668.00

Senior Director of Education & Training

Supervise LGBTQA+ Youth Program Coordinators. Oversee all program operations. Provide professional training on LGBTQA+ youth throughout PPKey's service area. \$33.82 x 3.5 hours per week x 52 weeks = \$6,155.00

2. Rent

The Rainbow Room meets in space that is rented from a local church. Rent is \$250 per month. \$250 x 12 months= \$3,000

3. Travel/Mileage

Mileage is included to cover staff travel to programs each week, professional trainings, and the Youth Development Summit.

3,500 miles x .50 p/m = \$1,750

4. Youth Development Summit Costs

Transportation rental

Our programs span a large geography and transportation can be a barrier for youth. We hope to charter two buses to transport youth to a central location for our Youth Development Summit. 2 buses x \$1,000 each = \$2,000

Food & Supplies for Youth Development Event

These costs will cover meals, beverages, and other supplies needed for the Youth Development Summit.

80 youth x \$12.50 per youth= \$1,000

5. Program Costs

Food and Supplies for weekly programs

Each week we provide snacks and beverages to youth at our meetings. We also need to purchase supplies for crafts, activities, etc.

 $150 \text{ p/m} \times 12 \text{ months} \times 3 \text{ programs} = 5,400$

Safer Sex Supplies

We distribute safer sex supplies such as condoms, latex dams, and water-based lubricant through our programs. This line item includes:

\$60 x 5 cases of condoms= \$300

\$50 x 10 boxes of latex dams= \$500

\$100 x 2 cases of lubricant= \$200

Total = \$1,000

Brochures & Printing

We distribute brochures on topics related to LGBTQ issues and sexual health at each of our program sites. We also print a promotional two sided card that we distribute to the community to help increase access to our programs.

2,000 brochures x .25 each= \$500

\$500 onetime cost for LGBTQA+ program promotional materials Total = \$1,000

6. Training Materials

We will provide each professional training participant with a folder including handouts, resources, etc. We will purchase training supplies including newsprint, markers, tape. We will also raffle off one book or training manual related to LGBTQA+ youth at each session. 12 trainings x \$62.50 each (folders, newsprint, other training supplies) = \$750

Grantee confirms that it has not had any change in its tax-exempt status, and shall notify the Foundation immediately of any such change.

4. Final Report and Records

Grantee hereby agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Foundation, its offices, directors, employees, and agents, from and against any and all claims, liabilities, losses, and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) directly, indirectly, wholly, or partially arising from or in connection with any act or omission by Grantee, its employees, or agents in applying for or accepting the Grant, in expending or applying the Grant funds or in carrying out any project or program supported by the Grant, except to the extent that such claims, liabilities, losses, and expenses arise from or in connection with any bad faith act or omission by the Foundation, its officers, directors, employees, or agent.

8. Termination
