WARWICK VALLEY HUMANE SOCIETY

I. A. Warwick Valley Humane Society was incorporated on May 20, 1954 as 501©3 not for profit membership corporation in the State of New York for the purpose of animal welfare. We have been managing the Warwick Animal Shelter since October 1968 with our Mission as follows:

~ to provide a clean, comfortable safe haven for lost, abandoned, unwanted, abused and neglected animals and to properly care for them with medical attention to the injured and ill until these animals are re-united with their families, adopted or appropriately released.

~ to assist local, county and state law enforcement agencies in the alleviation and investigation of suspected animal abuse.

~ to advocate for responsible pet ownership with each adoption or redemption and through the media (radio, TV, shelter tours, school programs etc)

~ to adopt dogs and cats that are spayed/neutered (unless a licensed veterinarian advises against for medical reasons), appropriately vaccinated, with dogs tested for heartworm, cats tested for Feline Leukemia and FIV.

~ to have any unsafe animals and animals that are sick, injured or behaviorally beyond rehabilitation, humanely euthanized by a licensed veterinarian.

B. Our organization has partnered with Safe Homes of Orange County (for victims of domestic violence) in that our shelter will admit the victims' pets for safekeeping without compensation for a period of up to 60 days and are available 24 hours a day as the need arises.

We are a Homeless Pets Club member and have several sponsors throughout our community promoting our pets for adoption.

Our Society spoke before our County Legislature to raise awareness for animal victims of abuse and neglect and received a signed Proclamation for April is Prevention of Animal Cruelty Month from our County Executive recognizing our organization and our efforts on behalf of all animals, wild or tame.

C. Our organization manages the operation of the Warwick Animal Shelter and provides animal control services to two municipalities and enforces local and state Dog Control Laws within our jurisdiction with 24 hour emergency animal control response for any animal in distress. Our Society created and manages the Spay, Neuter, Return (SNR) program for cats with subsidized funds from the Towns of Warwick and Chester in an effort to reduce the overpopulation of cats in these communities. The Town of Warwick is the 2nd largest township in New York State at 104.9 square miles with a population of over 33,000 and includes 4 Villages and 3 hamlets. The Town of Chester with 2 Villages is 25 square miles and has a population of 13,000. In addition, we serve as the impoundment facility for the Town of Tuxedo which is 49.4 square miles, population 4,000.

II. (A) Cat overpopulation is a public health risk with the inevitability of spreading rabies and other diseases, impacts the quality of life of neighborhoods, and causes pain and suffering for the kittens born of unvaccinated, unhealthy cats.

(B) 1. In 2003, our Humane Society created the SNR program to address these issues through spaying and neutering with the Town of Warwick and in 2006 with the Town of Chester. With the cooperation of The Animal Rights Alliance Low Cost Spay/Neuter mobile clinic for cats, \$20 certificates are purchased by residents of these two towns at our location for the spay or neuter of a cat including rabies vaccination and the balance of the surgery is paid by the SNR Fund which is subsidized by these two Towns and managed by our Society. The Town of Warwick provides \$4500 per year which allows for 150 and the Town of Chester provides \$1500.00 per year for 50 cats. For the past two years both funds have been exhausted by July. The \$20.00 cost to residents is more than affordable and prevents countless litters of kittens, many who would end up suffering and dying from starvation, diseases, illnesses and other animal attacks.

2. Objective I: to have additional certificates available for the balance of 2014 into 2015 to supplement the municipal funding.

Activities: We will advertise the availability of additional certificates obtained through the Gimbel Foundation Grant.

Objective II: to reduce the number of kittens from un-spayed female cats

Activities: Through education of the public with shelter tours currently housing 175 cats/kittens in overcrowded conditions and education about the health benefits to the adult cats and reducing the suffering/deaths of countless kittens yet to be born.

The SNR program is established and underway but needs additional funding to continue the rest of the year. Town funding is contingent upon available funds at budget time and may be reduced or withheld or hopefully increased. These two towns are aware of the importance of this program and its positive impact on our community.

3. This grant will serve the communities of Warwick and Chester, New York and the stray, abandoned, owned and feral cats who live within. The \$9000.00 grant will allow for 200 cats in the Town of Warwick and 100 cats in the Town of Chester to be spayed, neutered and vaccinated.

4. There are no other existing projects of this kind in our community and we are encouraging other municipalities to create their own SNR programs for their residents.

We host The Animal Rights Alliance (T.A.R.A.) mobile spay/neuter clinic at our shelter bi-annually and they are available in two surrounding towns bi-weekly at a charge of only \$70 per spay/neuter of a cat including a rabies vaccination. We consider T.A.R.A. a partner in our efforts to reduce cat overpopulation. Volunteers trap and transport to T.A.R.A. on an as needed basis.

C. 1. The anticipated outcomes of this project is more cats will be spay/neutered, fewer kittens will be born, neighborhood nuisances and public health risks will be reduced.

2. We will achieve the expected outcomes with the sale of each and every certificate and its use.

3. Progress will be tracked by the number of certificates purchased and used with the above stated outcomes.

D. This grant will supplement the depleted SNR fund and only be used for that purpose.

III. Each year we request funding for this program from our two Towns of Warwick and Chester and will also seek other grant opportunities to enhance the SNR program. Although we do not directly benefit from managing this fund, several studies by humane groups have verified that spaying and neutering is the only way to reduce pet overpopulation and that euthanizing does not achieve that goal. It is our efforts to educate the public through this fund that prevents euthanasia and reduces unwanted litters of kittens.

IV. A. Our Board of Directors consists of 8 volunteers who meet at least four times a year and is responsible for the funding the organization through fundraisers. Our committees consist of Fundraising committee, animal welfare committee and nominating committee. Decisions are made after input from the directors and by majority vote. Two directors are employed as Animal Care Attendants and one is employed as Shelter Manager.

B. Suzyn Barron is the President of Warwick Valley Humane Society since year 2000 and created the SNR program to assist the community's residents in taking responsibility for caring for cats, whether owned, stray or feral. Ms. Barron is an Animal Control Officer for the Towns of Warwick and Chester and has been the shelter supervisor since 2003, managing the staff, overseeing the welfare of our homeless pets, organizing rabies, acupuncture and teeth cleaning clinics, training and evaluating shelter dogs, rescuing animals in distress from frozen lakes to hoarding situations to animal abuse and preparing cruelty cases. She oversees the daily operation of the animal shelter and is available to the Local, County and State police around the clock. She also implemented the partnership with Safe Homes of Orange County in an effort to help the victims of domestic violence, both human and animal.

1. Use of Grant Funds

Grant funds must be expended within the grant period, for the purpose and objectives described in your grant proposal. Grant funds may not be expended for any other purpose without prior written approval by The Community Foundation. If there are significant difficulties in making use of the funds as specified in your proposal, or if the grant funds cannot be spent within the grant period, notify us in writing promptly.

Formal requests for extensions or variances must be submitted to the Foundation's Board of Directors for approval a minimum of 60 days before the end of the grant period.

Requests for variances or extensions are reviewed on a case-by-case basis and approved by the Board of Directors. If a request is denied, unused funds must be immediately refunded to the Foundation.

2. Payment of Grant Funds

The grant funds will be paid in full by the Foundation upon receipt of the signed Grant Agreement. Challenge grant funds will be paid in full upon receipt of the signed Grant Agreement and upon receipt of documentation providing evidence that condition(s) of the challenge grant has/have been met.

3. Certification and Maintenance of Exempt Organization Status

This grant is specifically conditioned upon Grantee's status as an eligible grantee of The Community Foundation. The Foundation has obtained a copy of the Grantee's IRS determination letter. Grantee confirms that it has not had any change in its tax-exempt status, and shall notify the Foundation immediately of any such change.

4. Final Report and Records

The Grantee will submit the Grant Evaluation report per the deadline set forth in the award letter. This report includes a narrative on outcomes based on goals and objectives set forth in the grant proposal and an expenditure report documenting use of grant funds. If equipment was purchased, copies of receipts need to be included.

5. Grantee's Financial Responsibilities

Grantee will keep records of receipts and expenditures of grant funds and other supporting documentation related to the grant at least four (4) years after completion of the grant and will make such records of receipts, expenditures and supporting documentation available to the Foundation upon request.

6. Publicity

The Community Foundation recommends publicity for the grant and acknowledging The Community Foundation in internal correspondence, brochures as appropriate; newsletters, annual reports and email blasts or e-newsletters.

7. Indemnification

In the event that a claim of any kind is asserted against the Grantee or the Foundation related to or arising from the project funded by the Grant and a proceeding is brought against the Foundation by reason of such claim, the Grantee, upon written notice from the Foundation, shall, at the Grantee's expense, resist or defend such action or proceeding, at no cost to the Foundation, by counsel approved by the Foundation in writing.

Grantee hereby agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Foundation, its offices, directors, employees, and agents, from and against any and all claims, liabilities, losses, and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) directly, indirectly, wholly, or partially arising from or in connection with any act or omission by Grantee, its employees, or agents in applying for or accepting the Grant, in expending or applying the Grant funds or in carrying out any project or program supported by the Grant, except to the extent that such claims, liabilities, losses, and expenses arise from or in connection with any bad faith act or omission by the Foundation, its officers, directors, employees, or agent.

8. Termination

The Community Foundation may terminate this agreement, withhold payments, or both at any time, if, in the Community Foundation's judgment: a) The Community Foundation is not satisfied with the quality of the Grantee's progress toward achieving the project goals and objectives; b) the Grantee dissolves or fails to operate; c) the Grantee fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this agreement.

9. Limitation of Support

This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the Grant and supersedes any previous oral or written understandings or agreements.
