Describe the project's key outcomes and results based on your goals and objectives. Provide the number of clients served and other relevant statistics.

Our main objective was to provide an enriching afterschool environment for students in kindergarten to sixth grade. The S.L. Gimbel Foundation allowed the YMCA of Orange to purchase educational and interactive program supplies used to support student's instruction in the after-school program. Our second objective was for students to become leaders and role models for their peers in the community. The supplies allowed us to implement team building activities, which enhanced the participant's leadership skills and grow as individuals.

The El Modena After-School Program served forty students each day from surrounding schools, Monday through Friday.

What were the challenges and obstacles you encountered (if any) in attaining your goals and objectives? How did you overcome and/or address the challenges and obstacles? What were the lessons learned?

An obstacle we encountered at the El Modena After-School Program was that the three year program funding did not include funding for supplies. The S.L. Gimbel Foundation allowed us to purchase program supplies that enhanced our after-school program.

We continue to strive to provide the highest quality program for our El Modena Community. We have been intentional in showcasing youth art projects and interactive activities to our families. This has created an environment conducive to parent involvement. Parents are now more actively involved in the program.

Describe the overall effect this grant has had on your organization.

This grant has allowed the YMCA of Orange to meet the needs of the young students in the El Modena community. The after-school program has provided mentoring, character development, and academic activities. These young people now have a safe place to go after school, which will nurture

their ambition to be productive at school and help them develop leadership skills.

Tell us a few success stories that made an impact on our organization and /or community as a result of this grant.

Last Fall, a fifth grade El Modena After-School participant was disengaged in much of the program. The participant was not completing homework and unwilling to participate in the academic enrichment portion of the day. The S.L. Gimbel Foundation allowed the YMCA of Orange to provide hands on, structured activities that increased the student's willingness to be actively engaged.

The S.L. Gimbel Foundation Funds has changed the atmosphere at the El Modena After-School Program. Participants are actively engaged in the program and are completing their homework. They look forward to the plethora of activities that they are now able to participate in that spark their creativity and allow them to be leaders in the community.
