

The Castro/Falk Scholarship Fund of the Coachella Valley Scholarship Information and Criteria

Sun Gold, Inc. represented by Efren Castro and Elynor Rudnick Falk, was active in agribusiness in the Coachella Valley, contributing substantially to the economy of the area.

The Castro/Falk Scholarship Fund of the Coachella Valley is established as an endowed scholarship by David Falk and Lisa Castro to honor the memory of Efren Castro and Elynor Rudnick Falk in perpetuity.

Who is eligible to receive the scholarship?

The Fund provides financial assistance in the form of scholarships to students who are U.S. citizens, and residents, or former residents, of Coachella Valley who demonstrate motivation, perseverance and a sincere desire to gain an education, be it high school, vocational school, community college, undergraduate or graduate college or university. There shall be no discrimination in the selection of students for aid based upon gender, race, religion, country of origin, or parentage.

Scholarships are provided to students who demonstrate financial need, and may be used for education-related expenses such as tuition, equipment, supplies, food, lodging and clothing. Funding may be provided for study abroad if it is part of a school's formal course of study. Funding shall not be provided for extracurricular activities not part of an educational program, such as vacations or participation in private social, religious or political activities.

Students receiving financial assistance from the Fund are required to maintain a minimum academic standing of "C" or its equivalent. Consistent failure to maintain qualifying academic status may disqualify students from receiving further financial assistance. Further, any criminal or otherwise illegal activity, lapse in appropriate conduct (e.g. cheating, plagiarism, illegal use of drugs or alcohol, expulsion from school), may disqualify students from receiving further financial assistance.

How to apply for the scholarship?

Eligible students must complete an application form. The application packet includes: Completed application form; two letters of recommendation (from an academic counselor or others not related to the applicant); and transcript. Final award recipients must provide evidence of enrollment in the academic institution to which funds will be paid on his or her behalf.

How are scholarship recipients selected?

Scholarship recipients are selected by a scholarship committee and approved by the Inland Empire Community Foundation Board of Directors. Applications are reviewed competitively, and may be supported by a personal interview with each finalist.
