Scholarship Application Guidelines

Application Deadline: April 2, 2021

The PAVEMENT RECYCLING SYSTEMS SCHOLARSHIP FUND in memory of Chuck Harmon, Dick Sprinkel and Gordon Lounsbury at The Community Foundation provides college financial assistance to graduating seniors who are pursuing post-secondary education through approved certified colleges or training institutes. Eligible graduating seniors must be residents of the City of Riverside or its neighboring communities.

Recipients are eligible to receive a continuing, year-after-year scholarship award to an accredited public or private institution of higher learning until the recipient graduates. The scholarship committee retains full authority to approve or disapprove of any student-selected institution. The scholarship awards are outright grant awards. No services will be required as a consequence of receiving the award. Scholarship awards are for tuition, books, education fees, and other education-related expenses.

The intent of the Scholarship award is to supplement other funds or savings for education. The Scholarship is meant to take the place of part-time work while attending school. The idea is that if coursework is treated as a job, higher grades will be earned, so the Scholarship is set up such that higher grades, in more rigorous classes get higher rewards. Scholarship awards are calculated based on total points earned per a formula that includes but not limited to the following considerations:

- Value per Credit - the higher the grade, the more points are earned;
- Number of Credits of each course
- Course Difficulty multiplier (Science and Math classes have a higher multiplier)
- College Course Level multiplier

Scholarship criteria:

- Minimum 3.0 G.P.A.
- High School Graduating senior planning to attend a college, university or approved trade school full-time
- Exhibit community and school involvement.
- Demonstrate financial need.
- Work experience is a consideration.

The application packet should include:

- 1) Completed application form
- 2) 2 letters of recommendation
- 3) Transcript
- 4) Essay
- 5) Copy of SAR (Student Aid Report)– EFC (Estimated Family Contribution) page only – if you completed FAFSA
