



2021 Youth Grantmakers Fund Grant Guidelines and Instructions Deadline: March 5, 2021 **San Bernardino - Youth Grantmakers**

Mission of the Inland Empire Community Foundation

The Inland Empire Community Foundation's mission is "Where giving grows."

The Foundation does this by raising, stewarding and distributing charitable assets by providing grants to nonprofit organizations, and working toward a shared vision of a vibrant, generous and just region — with unlimited opportunities. The Foundation focuses on building its endowment to ensure that the Inland Empire Community Foundation is *where giving grows*.

The Inland Empire Community Foundation maintains the rigorous national standards for excellence for community foundations and is a member of the National Council on Foundations and the League of California Community Foundations.

Background: Youth Philanthropy

The Inland Empire Community Foundation established the Youth Grantmakers (YG) Program in 2008 to encourage philanthropy among youth. Youth Grantmakers address issues important to them by being rigorously trained in grantmaking, the nonprofit sector, and decision making skills. Students ages 15 to 18 apply to the Youth Grantmakers through their high school administrative or counseling offices. Through a rigorous 10-month, hands-on curriculum, YG students build leadership skills, participate in community service activities, conduct a needs assessment of issues relevant to youth, make site visits to nonprofit organizations, review and analyze grant proposals, and make grant recommendations based on local needs.

The Youth Grantmakers Fund

The Youth Grantmakers Fund is a responsive grantmaking opportunity that provides financial support for projects, programs and/or activities that serve youth in such areas as Health and Human Services, Youth and Families, Arts & Culture and Civic and Public Benefit.

Eligibility

- Nonprofit, public benefit corporations with evidence of tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and not classified as a private foundation. Educational institutions are eligible to apply.
- Nonprofit agencies that serve youth residing in **the City of San Bernardino, neighboring communities (Colton, Grand Terrace, Highland, Loma Linda, Redlands, Yucaipa) and Victor Valley region (Adelanto, Apple Valley, Hesperia, Victorville, Barstow)** .
- Agencies that operate so that they do not discriminate in the hiring of staff or in providing services on the basis of race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, age, national origin or disability.

Grantmaking Objectives

- Involve youth in the development and implementation of the project, program and/or activity
 - Increase community involvement and volunteerism among youth
 - Promote values of personal responsibility in youth
 - Provide an avenue for internal exploration and personal empowerment of youth
 - Respect and promote diversity
 - Support intervention and prevention of social problems
 - Support and encourage youth creativity
 - Develop civic and public pride in youth
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Program Interest Areas

Grant proposals will be accepted that address issues important and relevant to youth. Program interest areas are broad based and may include areas of academic preparation, cultural inclusion, education and awareness, prevention and intervention, and other services that will help youth develop strong skills set --socially, physically, emotionally, and academically. Areas of specific interest to Youth Grantmakers as identified through a needs assessment include: *Academic Stress/Expectations and Stress; Mental Health/Depression; Eating Disorders; Sexual Abuse/Violence; and Drug & Alcohol Abuse.*

Funding Priorities

Proposals that delineate program activities that involve youth so that their issues are addressed are given priority such as (but not limited to):

- Arts, culture, dance, drama, music, writing
- Advocacy programs
- Educational classes
- Mentoring or tutorial programs
- Outdoor experiences, camps, etc.
- Programs led by youth instead of adults
- “Real life” learning experiences
- Service learning
- Teen hotlines
- Therapy

Grant Award

Applicants may request amounts in the following range: \$1,000 to \$2,500. **The maximum grant award is \$2,500.**

Grant Period

The grant period is up to one year. Projects, Programs and/or Activities may start as early as May 1, 2021 and must end no later than April 30, 2022.

Application Review

Grants are awarded on a competitive basis. Applications will be screened for eligibility and completeness by the Inland Empire Community Foundation (IECF) staff. The Youth Grantmakers will evaluate each application and will submit grant recommendations to the Inland Empire Community Foundation staff for final approval by the Foundation’s Board of Directors.

Notification of Results

All applicants will be notified of the results in writing by April 30, 2021.

1. Please read the eligibility requirements carefully.
2. Complete all forms and answer all questions.
3. **Submit the Application Packet via Mail or Email**
 - A) **Submit one (1) ORIGINAL (WITH ORIGINAL SIGNATURES) of the following:**
 - Completed Grant Application (Cover sheet, Narrative (two pages max), & Budget Page-4 pages total).
 - A list of your Board members and their affiliations.
 - Your current operating budget (Fiscal year or calendar year)
 - A copy of your current 501(c) (3) determination letter from the IRS.
