Through the generosity of our donors, in 2020, Inland Empire Community Foundation (IECF) invested more than \$25 million in grants in the Inland Empire and beyond. Over \$4 million were for scholarships and education.

Funds were awarded to a broad spectrum of nonprofits in our 27,000 square miles, two-county region. IECF's grantmaking falls generally into the following categories:

Riverside County Nonprofit Assistance Fund

In partnership with the Riverside County Board of Supervisors, \$5 million in CARES funding established the Nonprofit Assistance Fund to help nonprofits survive the impacts of COVID-19 on their business operations by providing flexible operating funds. The Inland Empire Community Foundation (IECF) was awarded the funds to administer, in partnership with the Riverside County Homeless Solutions and Workforce Department and the Inland Empire Funder's Alliance.

The Foundation's unrestricted grantmaking supports the capacity building needs of nonprofit organizations. The Community Impact Fund (\$298,381) supports training and workshops such as Board Governance, Fund Development, Leadership, Advocacy, Finance & Budgets, Evaluation, Marketing, and more.

IECF has been administering the S. L. Gimbel Foundation Fund, whose mission is to enhance the quality of life in memory of Susan Gimbel.

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enhancement, education, and human dignity. IECF awarded \$6,491,459 to nonprofits in partnership with the Gimbel Foundation trustees in 2020.

In addition to their grantmaking program, in 2020, the S.L. Gimbel Foundation Scholarship Fund awarded \$ 488,749 in financial support for low-income students. Scholarship awards are for students attending University of California, Riverside (UCR) and California State University, San Bernardino (CSUSB), who have unmet need to be used for tuition, books, education fees, housing and other educational expenses. The intent is to provide scholarships equally to students studying liberal arts and the sciences. Low income students, undergraduate or graduate, accepted to attend UCR or CSUSB and current students from all backgrounds regardless of age, race, religion, gender, sexual preference or national origin are eligible to apply. First generation college-going students, and/or traditionally underrepresented students in higher education are highly encouraged to apply.

The Inland Empire Community Foundation (IECF) award nearly \$4.9 million to 535 nonprofits that serve Riverside County residents. Additionally, \$250,000 was awarded specifically for capacity building and technical support programs that helped struggling nonprofits continue their services and build resiliency skills during the pandemic.

San Bernardino County Nonprofit Assistance Fund

San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors committed \$5 million to help nonprofits serving San Bernardino residents survive the impacts of

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COVID-19 on their operations. IECF administered and approved \$3.4 million for 216 nonprofits that had demonstrated reimbursable COVID-19 expenses or impacts. Additionally, \$250,000 was awarded for capacity building and technical support programs.

IEFA Rapid Response Fund

In February 2020, a pandemic hit the United States that proved to be devastating to those already teetering on the edge of survival in the Inland Empire. The Inland Empire Funders Alliance (IEFA) took swift action, and established the IE Funders Alliance Rapid Response Fund at the IE Community Foundation to provide critical and timely support for nonprofits providing critical services in the Riverside and San Bernardino counties in response to the COVID-19 crisis. A pooled fund that targeted private and public Foundations, Banks, and other funding entities, IEFA raised \$1,030,000 from 12 Funders. Core support grants ranging from \$10,000 to \$25,000 were awarded to 93 nonprofit organizations, totaling \$1,003,500 and served vulnerable and marginalized populations such as homeless, veterans, households under poverty line, immigrants and refugees, youth, people with disabilities, medically high-risk individuals, and the uninsured. Critical services provided included: health education, child care, food distribution, shelter, family supports.

IECF COVID-19 Resilience Fund

The Inland Empire Community Foundation established the COVID-19 Resilience to support nonprofit organizations on the front lines of

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COVID 19, to help them assist families and communities, and to support their survival throughout the pandemic. The grant focus were Basic Needs and/or Emergency services for low income people in the Inland Empire provided by single organizations or coalitions such as food, shelter, health care, childcare, cash assistance (up to \$20,000); and Capacity Building assistance to nonprofits for financial management and planning and strategies for long-term financial survival in the areas of technical assistance grants to individual nonprofits for financial management, planning, restructuring, legal, etc. (up to \$5,000) and remote work and technology adaptation for a single organization or coalition of groups (up to \$10,000). Over \$775,000 was raised from individual donors and corporate funders providing 64 grants to nonprofits for a total of over \$737,000.

complete count-Educate, Motivate, Activate. With two additional funding augmentation, the grand total contract from the state is \$3,268,620. Fifty five grants were awarded for a total of \$2,650,000.

In a milestone collaboration with advocacy/movement building and power building nonprofits, social services organizations, Riverside County and San Bernardino County, plus the Center for Social Innovation at University of CA, Riverside, the Inland Empire exceeded its 2010 self response rate for Census 2020 despite the COVID 19 pandemic challenges.

IECF was originally awarded \$2.4million by the CA State Census to serve as the Administrative Community Based Organization (ACBO) for Region 7 (Riverside and San Bernardino Counties). The contract is for

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implementing an outreach plan to hard to count (HTC) populations, via subcontracts to nonprofits in order to achieve a complete count-Educate, Motivate, Activate. With two additional funding augmentation, the grand total contract from the state is \$3,268,620. Fifty five grants were awarded for a total of \$2,650,000. A virtual celebration region-wide is being planned for mid-November.

IE Black Equity Initiative

In 2020, IECF was invited, following the murder of George Floyd, to host the Inland Empire Black Equity Fund, in partnership with the Black Equity Initiative and the IE Funder's Alliance. With a goal of raising \$5 million over two years, the IE BEI, IEFA, and IECF are using trust-based philanthropy to engage over 20 Black-led and Black-serving organizations to identify their needs and distribute grants. IECF is hosting the funds and the RFP process, in collaboration with these partners. IECF's Board made a significant contribution of \$150,000 to the fund once it was opened, helping initiative IECF's work on its racial, gender, and economic equity strategy.

Inland Economic Growth and Opportunity Initiative (IEGO)

In 2020, IECF continued hosting and leading the Inland Economic Growth and Opportunity Initiative(IEGO), a Brookings-led planning process that has turned into a full blown regional network working to create more high quality jobs in the region. In 2020, IEGO completed its governance structure, seated an executive committee, developed its mission, vision and values, and built an investment plan focused on its first cluster opportunity around Sustainable Logistics, Goods Movement, and Supply

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Chains. IECF hired Jobs for the Future, a national consulting firm, to provide backbone support, and provided significant leadership through its CEO. With support from the Irvine Foundation, IEGO diversified the partners at its table, centered equity in its plans, and continued to promote the potential for bi-county collaboration.

Just San Bernardino

IEGO is the fiscal manager for Just San Bernardino, directing James Irvine Foundation funding to support a 10-member collaboration working on a People's Plan for an Inclusive Economy for the City of San Bernardino. These 10 organizations represent racial equity, social justice, workers and Labor, community organizing and advocacy, education, restorative justice, entrepreneurship, housing, environmental justice and more - all focused on the City of San Bernardino and surrounding communities. Their involvement at various economic and community development tables has been supported through this investment, as well as giving them the capacity to advocate for community-led needs and opportunities and locally-owned economic and community development projects. One member of this table is a participant at the IEGO coalition and helps lead a black and Brown Collective with regard to the cluster strategy in Sustainable Logistics. IECF is using trust-based philanthropy in partnership with these organizations to implement this work and distribute funds.

LISTOS Riverside County

IECF is helping to build community resiliency and connect state

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residents to preparedness and response efforts. IECF received a grant from California Office of Emergency Services, (Cal OES) to build community resiliency and connect Californians to preparedness and response efforts by empowering community based organizations (CBOS) to provide emergency preparedness education and resources to vulnerable and diverse populations. Subgrants were awarded to 23 organizations totaling nearly \$2million and has 311,000 engagements as of December 31, 2020, representing 128% over our goal of 243,000 engagements despite COVID challenges.

The funding comes from Listos California - a campaign led by the Governor's Office of Emergency Services and California volunteers to make sure residents at most risk during natural disasters are safe and better prepared. IECF received \$2.1 million to support nonprofits in Riverside County provide education and awareness training and resources on natural disaster preparedness.

Youth Grantmakers

The Youth Grantmakers (YG) Program was created to empower youth to address issues important to them by participating in grantmaking. Through this program, young people become active agents of change, preparing them for responsive community leadership and practical hands-on service. Made up of high school students from across the two-county region, there are three Youth Grantmakers groups: Riverside, Coachella Valley, San Bernardino. A YG program in Idyllwild is composed of middle school students.

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During the 2019-20 academic year, nearly 75 Youth Grantmakers across the two-county region strengthened their leadership skills as they participated in philanthropy, giving away over \$54,735 to nonprofits that are working on issues of concern to students in Inland Empire high schools. Students learned to read and analyze a grant application, respectfully debate the most critical needs while learning to listen to others' perspectives, and prioritize the many worthwhile requests. An endowment fund was created in 2014 to ensure this valued initiative continues to support young people to understand, invest in, and change their communities.

The Compensation Committee gathers appropriate salary survey information from organizations including, but not limited to, the Council on Foundations, the League of California Community Foundations and others. Local conditions are also taken into account. The Compensation Committee makes a recommendation to the Executive Committee regarding CEO and staff pay ranges, and specifically about CEO pay and other benefits. The Executive Committee has Board authorization to determine the President and CEO's compensation package, within ranges approved by the Board.

The President and CEO determines the annual salaries of other officers and key employees using the ranges approved by the Compensation Committee.
